



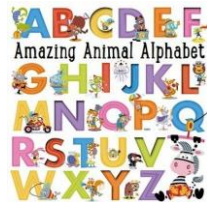

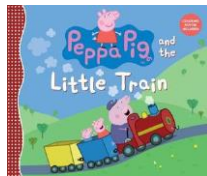
AMAZING ANIMAL ALPHABET

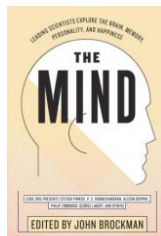

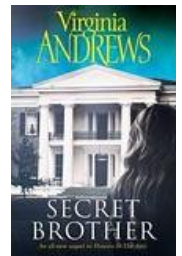

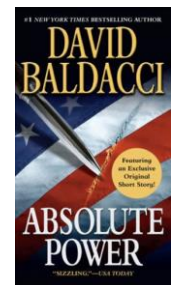
SECRET BROTHER – V. Andrews.

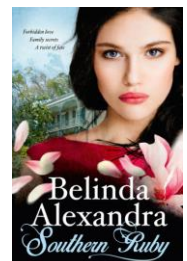
ABSOLUTE POWER – D. Baldacci.

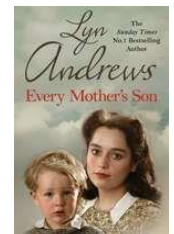
SOUTHERN RUBY – B. Alexandra.

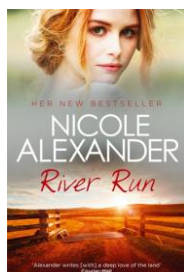

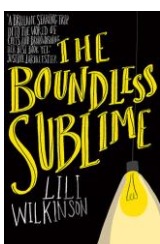

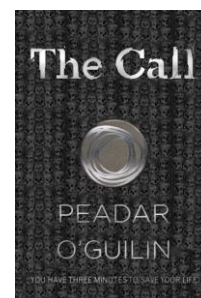


THE BOUNDLESS SUBLIME – L. Wilkinson

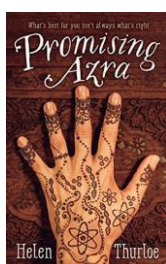
